### Service Description:

JMHC provides a level of intensive case management services to assist consumers in their path towards recovery by employing a strengthsbased approach. The program provides a comprehensive range of treatment that is recovery based and culturally competent and includes supportive services such as assistance with living arrangements, managing money and coordinating benefits, coordinating primary health care, substance abuse treatment, vocational and educational support, socialization, medication prescription and monitoring, and assistance with activities of daily living. These supportive activities build a foundation for trusting relationships with consumers who are the leaders on the team in planning their recovery goals. Woven throughout is the opportunity for community based psychotherapeutic support in the consumer's natural environment.

Adult trauma treatment services provides trauma focused, stage oriented therapy and intensive case management services for adults who are experiencing trauma related symptoms, and diagnosed with a mental health and/or co-occurring disorder. The level of care is dependent on consumer need and ranges from day treatment to outpatient. Services include therapy, case management, psychosocial rehabilitation, psychiatric prescribing and related nursing, and supported referrals to specialty resources. Evidence based individual and group modalities are utilized including cognitive behavioral therapy, EMDR, Seeking Safety and DBT groups, and specialized treatment for severe trauma related disorders including dissociative disorders.

UJIMA is a culturally specific program dedicated to promoting the selfidentity and quality of life of African American families who are affected by alcohol and other drug use, trauma, and other mental health related issues. This treatment program provides individual, group and family sessions addressing substance use disorders or cooccurring substance use and mental health disorders with case management services and integrated psychiatry services.
